Dear Friends,

I have been doing well since I returned from my cancer treatment in January. I did have a slight setback last month when I got a mild case of pneumonia. The doctor gave me an antibiotic to take for two weeks, and then I was fine. I appreciate all of your prayers for my health as the Lord has surely answered. One doctor, at the outpatient clinic at the hospital, told me that I am the longest living cancer patient that they have ever treated. In 2004, I was only given 18 months to three years to live, and now I have lasted over nine years.

We had an evangelist come to our island the first of this month, and we enjoyed having him here in our guest apartment. To get prepared for the large crowd, the church put up an outside pavilion. We were able to help with the tin roof so we could accommodate all the people. We then assisted with transporting people from the distance villages. One preacher in a distant village asked to borrow \$80 to buy gas to run their church bus. When he came to pay it back, we told him that we would share this expense and to only pay back half. He then said this was an answer to prayer because he did not have money to buy gas to go on visitation this week, and now he could go. Gas is expensive here at over five dollars a gallon, so it costs a lot to provide transportation to church. We praise the Lord that several people gave their hearts to the Lord during this revival.

I am still preaching in an English service on Sundays and holding a Bible Study here at the radio station each Wednesday evening. Most of our people attending the Bible study are from the Philippines and do not speak the local language.

The Gospel continues to go out 24 hours a day on both the AM and FM stations. We thank the Lord for the opportunities we have through broadcasts and music to present the Gospel.

John and Christa Boylston (WWNTBM missionaries) and their five children arrived on March 21st. They are staying in our guest apartment and guest room until they get into their own housing.
