After an extended stay in the States, Rose Marie returned to Peru and is faced again with an overwhelming amount of work. To be honest, this prayer letter was begun in April but I had to set it aside in order to prepare for the missions team. I apologize for not sending it as it stood, I intended to add more. It's a good thing that I am busy, I will do my best to keep you better informed .

Do you recall what Paul saw in Acts 16:6-11? Prior to God planting the church in Philippi, Paul was burdened for eleven villages that needed the Gospel.

God keeps placing me in areas we did not know existed. Since it is difficult to get to all of the areas of ministry opening up, I need to pray harder for laborers to help complete the fieldwork. The jungle trips to Pucallpa are one of those things. It is understandable why people don't go there: Malaria, Yellow Fever, Dengue Fever, heat, But!... A short one hour flight from Lima and I am faced with a church two years old begging for help.

This month gave me a chance to take a two hour drive passing through eight mountain villages because of an invitation to Antioquia. There are two other villages in the same canyon; all of them that need to hear the Gospel. They are enslaved to cultic Spiritism, Animism, traditionalism and who knows what else in-between. Another invitation opened for me to visit

the church of my Spanish teacher which is less than an hour's drive away. Again, there is more work than I can do even if I had the time. There is one thing that these opportunities share, God has started something according to Philippians 1:8.

There is a profound resource and energy at my disposal; It is the contact with the students at La Molina Christian School. They already know the language, many of them are already familiar with the families of these areas, and they understand the culture and customs. Pepe is a tenth grader this year. His life was spared a few years ago when he was hit by a truck in front of the school. He is my Timothy. We are preparing him to serve perhaps with me in Antioquia and the surrounding villages near his home.

My invitation to them is to expand the tents of their habitation, lengthen their cords and strengthen their stakes. I took that challenge and I am challenging them. It is obvious

that the Lord directed me into this unique opportunity to take my students through the book of James. We have only finished chapter one because they ask questions or we intentionally slow down to make sure they understand. It is almost impossible to use this technique in a formal classroom setting. When they are asked to read the verses out loud, they still feel intimidated with their English language skills. But, there is time well spent being able to explain many words using the Spanish translation. When one of them is invited to the table, the whole class starts asking, "When is it my turn again?" They love the attention and personal time given them. It is breaking down barriers and opening witnessing opportunities for the whole family. One mother approached me after school to thank me because she thought she was losing her son. During an argument she was having with him, she told him she needed to get him professional help. He responded, "I am. Mr. Blumer meets with me every week." His class is the only class that is able to do that because the size of the class he is in allows for it. Most of the schedules are not that easy to tap into.

Upon hearing of the sessions, one fifth-grade teacher brought me a list of seven names he would like for me to begin meeting with. I explained to him that I would have to meet with all of the students in his class, not just the 'trouble makers'. Unless we have time to talk to them,

we have no idea whether or not a child is struggling with something, just because they are 'quiet' in class. Please pray that we will be able to fit sometime during the day, twenty or more children into the program over the course of a few weeks.

The small church we help and attend regularly is stabilizing after their pastor resigned. The Baptist Mid-Missions planter which started the church has returned to preach each Sunday and support them, however, he is in the midst of starting another work three hours away. I am praying that our involvement shows them that we care and are not going to abandon them during this time. May God grant them His provision and give them guidance; Our prayer, your prayer, and the church's.
