- We praise God for providing a home for us in Mexico at about half the normal price.
- We also are very grateful for all those that have helped us with funds for moving.

Well, there are some very exciting things happening that I need to make you aware of. Unless the Lord prevents it, we will be moving down into Mexico in the last weeks of March. Many things are beginning to fall into place to make the move possible; in fact this past week we were able to secure a home to rent . Praise the Lord!

These next two months are going to be quite busy with all the packing and getting rid of most of our household goods here, finishing out the rest of our scheduled meetings, and saying our goodbyes to friends and family members before we go. At times I thought that we'd never see the day to make the move come, but now that it is in sight there doesn't seem to be enough time in a day to do all that needs to be done.

Although some very big things like minimum support, housing arrangements, etc. have fallen into place for us, there are still many small details yet to be worked out. We would greatly appreciate your prayers for these specific things:

Visas— Mexico will give us visas for at least 30 days or as much as 6 months. 6 month visas would be a great blessing by cutting back on the number of trips to the border.

Travel— Although the Mexican government seems to be cracking down on the cartels, the journey into Mexico can still be very dangerous.

Appliances & Furnishing— Now that we have a home to go to we will have to completely furnish it upon arrival. Carrying furniture is not very cost effective due to fuel prices and nearly 20% tariff for importing it into Mexico.

Language— If I understand the schedule correctly we will be able to start language school after the Summer break ends. Please, pray that we will be able to quickly grasp the culture and language.

Permanent Residency—The next big step in this process will be to get Permanent Residency papers in Mexico. Having residency would allow us to own vehicles and property in Mexico as well as eliminate our need to go to the border to renew visas. The process to obtain residency isn't usually smooth or inexpensive. Please, pray that the Lord will move it along in a more timely fashion.

Once again I would like to thank you for all that you have done to aid us on this journey.
