We have been busy over the past couple of months and have seen God's blessings. We have had new visitors almost every week at the church. Even with these many blessings, we still need your prayers. Through our visitation, God has opened the doors to share the Gospel with our visitors. Mitcher is a man that lives right behind the church. His past is not a pleasant one, but he has been attending the past couple months on a regular basis. One afternoon, we stopped by his house, and we were able to present the Gospel. Mitcher told me that he was almost ready, which means he thinks there is something in his life that is holding him back from being saved. On the Sunday before, I used an illustration of two fishermen that were recently lost at sea. They believed they would come home after fishing but never returned. I preached that we know not what tomorrow holds. Mitcher told me that this was bothering him the whole week. He has yet to receive Christ.

Sam is another man who is under conviction. His wife was led to the Lord by my mother and now teaches on Wednesday nights. Two of their children received Christ at VBS and are faithful to church. Sam has been coming, and when salvation is presented, it is easy to see the Holy Spirit working on his heart. Maura told him of the time when she had no food in the house or money to buy it. She began to boil water while trusting God, and a family friend showed up with a bag of rice and case of chicken. She keeps telling Ishmael to trust God because He can help in our time of need.
